


Riverine Flood Risk Information Card: Port Fairy 3284

You can ensure you are always up to date by following these easy actions:

Step 1 Prepare for Flood

What should I do?

Leaving early is always the safest option in Port Fairy, especially if predicted flood levels are higher than 4.55 m at the Toolong Gauge. This is because vehicle access in and out of your local area will be threatened.



Step 2

Monitor Moyne River (Toolong) water levels bom.gov.au/vic/flood

- Select 'River Conditions' (above the map)
- Click on Glenelg Hopkins on the right.
- Find the Toolong gauge and hover over it.
- Compare river height to the stream gauge heights on the other side of this card to determine if flooding is likely on your property (see below).



Step 3

Check emergency information and warnings emergency.vic.gov.au

Look out for:

- A Flood Watch for Glenelg Hopkins, Victoria
- A Flood Watch for the South West Weather District

Emergency Warning


You are in imminent danger and need to take action now. You will be impacted.
